The news is creating havoc of the weather, creating a picture of disaster-hit Himachal close to us. Houses, roads and the development of the state are trembling, this attitude of the executioner weather on the mountains is defaming. We do not want any tourists to come here in this season. Don't even want any disturbance on our destinations, but then in many tests together, the rain chose us and the clouds created havoc to scare us. Traveling in Himachal is not only difficult, but on every path of life, a terrifying landscape of sky emerges every time. Himachal's pain is increasing since last one week. This pain is only of Himachal which we have been facing alone for years. There may have been some mistakes, but not so wrong that the hill state should be left alone in the indifference of the weather forever. However, the loss of about five hundred crores in the last fifteen days has told the progress, trend and relevance of this state. What is the fault of that family of Kotgarh's Madhavani village, whose very existence was snatched away or what is the fault of faith in the Shrikhand Yatra where a traveler lost his modesty. In the gruesome picture of the weather of Shimla, the death of the husband, wife and son buried in the collapsing house of Madhavani is haunting, then the havoc of the rain cannot be measured considering the way the danger is increasing under the crumbling mountains. Whom to blame, where to find habitual holes in human progress or mountain development.

The scene of drowning in Una is no less than the market of Pandoh, nor is the distance reducing in the Chamba roads. Looking at the kind of potholes or rivers that are in spate, only disaster management bells can be rung or now a lot has to be learned from the history of flood-like situation. Somewhere in the priorities of the state, we are not ignoring the dreaded aspects of the weather. Are they developing against the laws of nature? We are not caught in this trouble just like that, this dispute should be considered with the mountain cover on the face of national standards. In fact, wherever the natural role of drainage has been tampered with or the instructions for development have been ignored, the daggers of the weather have emerged there.

In such a situation, the mountain will not be protected in the national consciousness only by considering it as a draft of the environment, but suitable grants are needed in the development options. Drainage of water coming out of Himachal or Himachal needs high quality management and innovation in development norms so that human settlements do justice to the nation. A national project of channelization will have to be prepared to preserve all the rivers, streams, ravines and wells in their natural form, while a national concept should be decided in support of the needs of mountain development. The mountain standards of urban and rural development are neither able to get full financial support from the policies of the central government, nor is such a model being decided where the balance of development and people's life can be safely maintained amidst the indifference of the weather. However, the common citizen also needs to understand the parable that arises with the weather. Investigation: France's riots give a lesson, the rebellion of youth incites for the destruction of their own neighborhood

Urban insurgencies in France over the past forty years have been dominated by youth anger, targeting symbols of the state and the state – such as town halls, social centres, schools and shops. It is such anger that in front of everyone incites people to destroy their own neighborhood. The recent riots in France are not surprising. These riots followed a pattern similar to that which had erupted in 1981 in the eastern suburbs of Lyon. The riots that followed are today also known as the 'Summer of Minguet', in which a young man is killed or injured by the police and violence erupts in the area and surrounding suburbs. In such a situation, any person, even your neighbor, becomes uncontrollable, as happened in the 2005 riots and is happening even today. Urban insurgencies in France over the past forty years have been dominated by youth anger, targeting symbols of the state and the state, such as town halls, social centres, schools and shops. It is such anger that in front of everyone incites people to destroy their own neighborhood. All citizens condemn such acts, but can also understand why this is happening. Elected representatives, unions, churches and mosques, social workers and teachers admit their helplessness and this creates an institutional and political vacuum. Of all such rebellions, the one that erupted in the 'Summer of Minguet' of 1981 was the only one that showed the way to a social movement. The march against equality and racism in December 1983 was a result of this. More than one lakh people participated in it and the media gave it a prominent place. It was the first exhibition of its kind in France. After this, till now no such movement has been seen emerging. In every riot, politicians are ready to play the same old stereotyped roles. The right wing condemns violence, stigmatizing neighborhoods and police victims, the left wing condemns injustice and promises social policies. In 2005, the then Minister of the Interior, Nicolas Sarkozy, stood by the side of the police. Emmanuel Macron, the current French president, has expressed sympathy for the boy killed by police in Nanterre, but politicians and the president are hardly heard in the neighboring areas concerned. We remain silent until the society at large begins to rediscover the problems of Bonniely (a suburb of France) and the police here. There are some simple lessons to be learned from the recurring riots and their scenarios in urban areas of France. The first is that the country's urban policies miss their goals. In the last forty years a lot of efforts have been made for housing and facilities. Apartments are of better quality, social centre, schools and colleges are there, public transport is there. On the other hand, the social and cultural diversity of disadvantaged suburbs has declined. Most people are poor or economically insecure and are either the descendants of immigrants or are immigrants themselves. Firstly, those who can leave early Bonlieu are given opportunities and resources and this is only done when poor people from faraway places are resettled there. Due to the environment created in this way, where the conditions are improving, the social conditions are also getting better. While people may not be willing to talk about underprivileged neighborhoods, there is a social process at work that can actually be seen in a ghetto, where there is a growing gap between neighboring neighborhoods and their environment. Clear, but this colony is strong and self-controlled from within. Despite the cash and the goodwill of the local representatives, people feel excluded from the society just because they have different origins, culture or religion. Even after the work of social policies and representatives, the settlements do not have their own institutional or political resources. While often communist-led suburbs have benefited greatly from strong support from left-leaning political parties, trade unions and popular education movements, today's suburbs rarely have leaders of their own to speak up. Social activists and teachers There is no dearth of goodwill, but most people do not live where these people work. This distance works both ways and riots in the past have shown that elected representatives and associations have no grip on settlements where people feel destitute. Appeals for peace are being ignored. This rift is not only social but also political. We are increasingly seeing youth fighting with the police. Both the groups are acting like 'gangs' with their own hatreds and territories. In such a state legal violence and the youth are confined within the ambit of their actual or potential crime. The police are being treated as mechanically racist on the basis that any youth is prima facie a suspect. Young people hate the police, this leads to police racism and youth violence. Such a war is usually played at a very low level. When a young man is killed, everything explodes everywhere. But this time there is something new in such a sad repetition. The first is the rise of the right wing, which is closely related to the political scene. It is not only on one side. Racist causes of insurgency are increasingly emerging, talking of vandalism and immigration, and there are fears that this could lead to electoral success. Second, the political left has been paralyzed politically and intellectually. It does not seem to suggest any political solution other than police reform. As long as the outlying settlements continue to be neglected, as long as the youth of France and the security forces continue to clash, it will be difficult to see that there will not be another police lapse and the riots that follow.
