How far from Shimla is Himachal

When Himachal Chief Minister Sukhwinder Sukhu camped in areas affected by heavy rains for three consecutive days, the scale of relief changed. That is, the people of Himachal trapped in the situation of flood and excessive rains were exposed and thousands of people were rescued safely from the trap of rain. If tourists stranded in Chandratal Lake or Parvati Valley from Kullu-Manali can safely leave for their homes, then it is a touch of the government to be present on the spot outside Shimla. In such a situation, the question is why the political-administrative corridors of the capital Shimla do not allow the state-level vision to be strengthened. Although the truth is that various departments must have thought while sitting in Shimla that how to protect the state during the monsoon cycle, but no one visited Himachal. The capital does not have time to see every corner of the state. In such a situation, the presence of the Chief Minister in the disaster affected areas proves that the decisions are accurate and correct in the light of the occasion. Actually, many Himachals have started running within Himachal, but the gap of administrative hold is visible in the arrogance of the capital. A period had begun when some regional offices sprouted on the path of administrative decentralization, but now they are irrelevant and unarmed pigeons, who only give officers an opportunity to get promoted. The need is even today that Shimla to Bharmour and Sirmaur should look alike or that Himachal from Channaur to Kinnaur should think alike. It is impossible that the signing of files should continue to be costly and lengthy in the blaze of the capital. The system of good governance in Himachal still runs in the shadow of bureaucracy under the Babugiri of the Secretariat. The record room of Himachal's files may crown the capital, but when questions of regional identity emerge, the pain increases at the time of snowfall, floods or other calamities.

For example, Himachal's education department divides the state into so many pieces regarding the annual school holidays that it itself does not know when it will rain and when it will snow. The horticulture department, while counting the cooling hours of apples, forgets why mangoes did not grow on the boots of Bilaspur-Hamirpur or why Kangra's kinnow dried up on the branches. If Shimla sees Himachal's industrial development between Parwanoo and BBN, then due to being close to the capital, all the traffic planning would have got entangled in the traffic jam there. To know the rain of Himachal, one has to understand the pain of every river, ravine or drain. If the wounds are due to repeated drowning of Una, then it is also due to the raging floods of Manjhi last year. Who would remember that Dharampur's bus stand is now a story of drowning in rains. The Transport Department can make a policy by meeting in Shimla, but cannot see the broken chain of public transport. New buses must have arrived and the green signal must have been given, but Shimla will not describe the broken journeys of government buses every day. Who can tell where the years old Volvo bus leaked in this rain. Who will show that the Volvo ticket to Haridwar will now be completed in a normal bus journey. Obviously there is a difference between politics and good governance. Capital Shimla can be a heaven for politics, but for good governance, difficult areas have to be saved from being hell. Will it be known sitting in Shimla that how many barr (bugs) fly directly from the maize field and attack people in this season. Hundreds of snakes would come out during the rains and bite people. In the paddy cultivation in the rainy season, the feet of women are in danger from so many poisonous creatures. situation, there are many distances in Shimla's thinking even today to test Himachal.

## Manipur: It is not right to throw mud at the army, such statements are dangerous for the country

Those who malign the army in Manipur are committing treason. This is the army, due to which Assam, Nagaland, Mizoram and Manipur remain an integral part of India. The geographical unity of Manipur is linked to the whole of India. It cannot be protected by raising divisive issues. It has been more than two months, the statements coming in the midst of improving-deteriorating situation in Manipur should make us worry. Speaking to reporters at the US Consulate in Kolkata, US Ambassador Eric Garcetti said that the incidents in Manipur are a matter of humanitarian concern. According to the report of the English daily The Hindu, he said, 'We wish for peace. You don't have to be Indian to care when you see children dying in violence. If asked, we are ready to assist in any way. The guiding principle should be that everyone feels connected. We can bring more collaborations, more projects and more investments there. We are concerned with the East and Northeast of India. We are concerned with the people, places, capabilities and future here. Belous love in China's reach area bordering Myanmar, Bangladesh, Nepal, Bhutan is not causing concern, although Garcetti thought it necessary to state that America's concern is not strategic. Biren Singh requested Zoramthanga to take steps to protect the Meitei residents of Mizoram. According to reports, as a result of the violence in Manipur, he fled to Mizoram, discovering more than twelve thousand Christian cookies. The next day, according to a Times of India report, Biren Singh told the media in Imphal, 'Mainly the Kuki terrorists should stop the violence, or else they will have to face the consequences'. I appeal to the armed Maitis not to attack anywhere and maintain peace. The meaning is very clear from the words. In language like ultimatum, there is no glimpse of this bitter truth that both sides are fighting according to the opportunity. This is the inevitable tragedy of a strong sense of alienation and a narrative built on the basis of religion and race. For the first time, the fire in Manipur forced the Indian Army to indirectly counter a politician. Hindustan Times report of May 31: Chief of Defense Staff General Anil Chauhan said that the clashes in Manipur are not related to anti-insurgency operations, it is mainly caste violence. Three days ago, Biren Singh had said, '40 Kukis were killed in an encounter between security forces and militants.' It was also the first time that Maiti-Kuki was seen inside the army. The army of a diverse country is compelled to remind itself of the permanent and immutable principle that all ranks of the Indian Army are free from discrimination of race, caste, creed, gender. The army also released a video showing a barricade group of women preventing soldiers from taking action against armed militants. The army could not fire on the women, so it had to release 12 militants belonging to a Meitei militant outfit. The result of the spread of canker sore is that the army, the last weapon in defense of India's geographical integrity, started being targeted. The Indian Space Research Organization (ISRO) is continuously setting new records in space. Since 2014, it has successfully launched 44 space craft missions and 42 launch vehicle missions. Now the American space agency 'NASA' also wants to work with ISRO. Chandrayaan-3 is completely 'Made in India'. This is India's third Chandrayaan mission after the failure of Chandrayaan-2 in the year 2019, which will be launched today from the space center at Sriharikota in Andhra Pradesh. The same launching vehicle has been used in Chandrayaan-3, which was used in Chandrayaan-2. There are many scientific instruments in this vehicle, which will study the surface of the moon. In March this year, the necessary tests of this vehicle were successfully completed. In this, the possible conditions that could come during the launch on the moon were assessed. Chandrayaan-3 has three modules namely Propulsion, Lander and Rover respectively. The 'Propulsion Module' carries an instrument called 'Spectro Polarimetric of Habitable Planet Earth' (SHAPE) to study spectral and polar measurements of Earth from lunar orbit, and will carry the lander and rover up to 100 km of lunar orbit. In addition, the propulsion module also has a scientific instrument as a value addition, which will be operated after the separation of the lander module. The lander is equipped with the capability to perform a 'soft landing' on a designated lunar site and deploy the rover, which will carry out chemical analysis of the moon during its mobility. If this time the lander of Chandrayaan-3 is successful in landing on the surface of the moon, then India will become the fourth country in the world to create such a record after America, Russia and China.

Virat and Yashasvi remained at the crease till the end of the second day's play. During the batting, Virat Kohli left behind former Indian opener Virender Sehwag in terms of runs. # Yashasvi set a flurry of records, became the first Indian opener to score a century in debut test abroad

Shreyas Iyer scored a century for India in the last debut test before Yashasvi. He scored 105 against New Zealand in 2021 at Kanpur. Lala Amarnath was the first Indian player to score a century on Test debut for India. Young Mumbai batsman Yashasvi Jaiswal has scored a brilliant century in his international debut. Yashasvi made his debut against the West Indies in Dominica. He scored a century in the first innings on Thursday (July 13) on the second



day of the Test match. Yashasvi shared a 229-run partnership with captain Rohit Sharma. Rohit got out after scoring 104 runs. Yashasvi created a flurry of records by putting hundreds. He is the 17th batsman from India to score a century on debut. Shreyas Iyer had scored a century for India in the last Test before Yashasvi. He scored 105 against New Zealand in



2021 at Kanpur. Lala Amarnath was the first Indian player to score a century on debut Test for India. He scored 118 runs against England in 1933. Yashasvi created history- Talking about Yashasvi, he is the third Indian opener to score a century in the debut test. Shikhar Dhawan did it in 2013 against Australia in Mohali and Prithvi Shaw did it in 2018 against West Indies in Rajkot. Yashasvi created history by scoring a century in the very first Test while debuting on foreign soil. He is the first Indian opener to do so. Not only this, he is the third player to score a century on debut against the West Indies. Rohit Sharma scored 177 runs in Kolkata in 2013. At the same time, Prithvi Shaw scored 134 runs in 2013 in Rajkot. 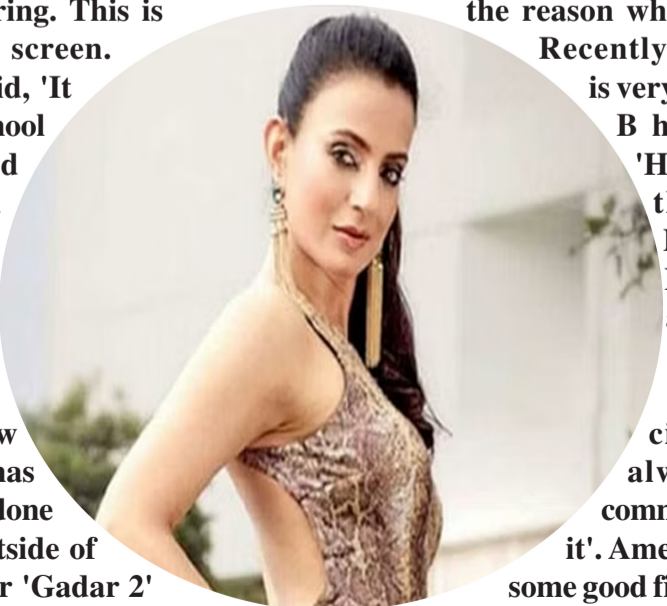

Do you think the film has benefited from these controversies? - Many films released before and after The Kerala Story were linked to controversies and there was a lot of debate on news channels, probably more than our film, But it could not ensure that people would like the film. So I think no matter what reasons one wants to attach to the success of a film or how much pleasure one gets by defaming a film, it has been proven time and again that for a film to be successful it needs to be well-executed with good performances. There should be a film, there should be proper direction and there should be emotions, which can connect with people.
